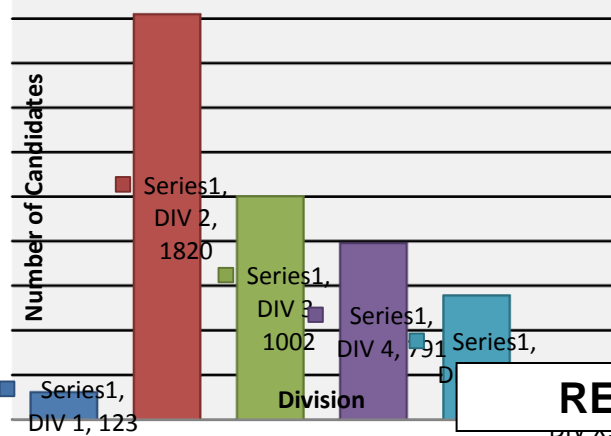

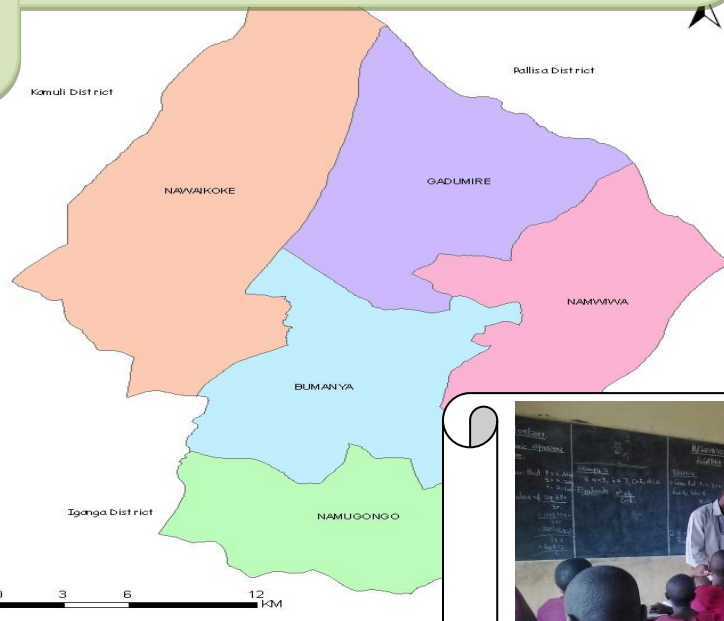
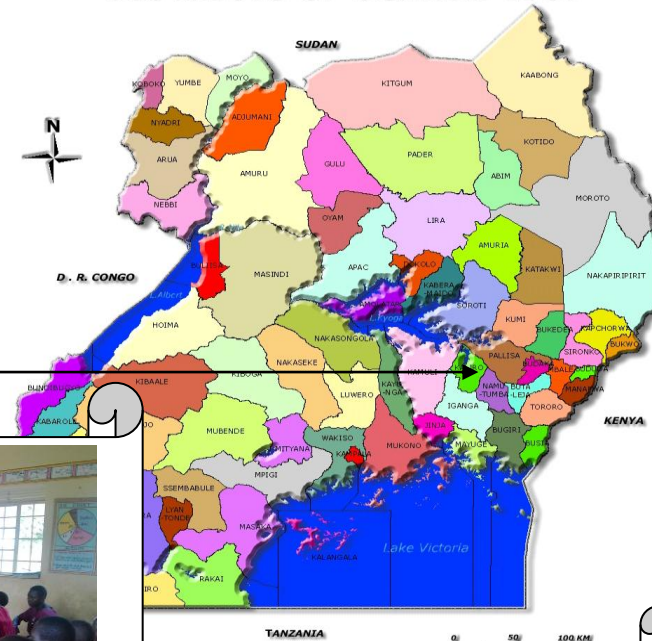

RE: RELEASE OF 2017 PLE RESULTS

UNEB officially released the said examinations on 12th January 2018 by the Education Minister and First Lady Hon. Janet Museveni. A total of 646,190 candidates registered for PLE examinations in the whole country compared to last year's 639,037 candidates. Of this number, 466,235 (72.0%) were Universal Primary Education (UPE) beneficiaries. Only 179,955 (28%) of the candidates were Non-UPE. However, the results for 2,559 candidates were withheld over suspected malpractice as compared to last year's 1,886 candidates.

Nationally, by percentage pass, Fort Portal Municipality emerged the best with 98.7% followed by Ntungamo Municipality. Kaliro district was ranked the 109th out of 156 districts and municipalities that presented candidates. The district improved by 47 positions from last years' 5th last position. By percentage of failures, the worst district was Kween with 29.1%, followed by Bukwo with 25.5%, Tororo with 19.1%, Kayunga 18.7, Mbale with 18.7%, Mayuge with 18.5%, Kamuli with 17.2%, Buvuma with 17.1%, Budaka with 217.0% and then Bududa with 17.0%. However, the most important thing and probably the most disturbing if not the most surprising is that out of the last 10 districts in the country, 8 of them are from the East and this time only 2 are from Busoga region.

Kaliro District PLE Performance:

The district registered a total of 4,425 compared to last year's 5,239 candidates in 69 UNEB centres sitting in 45 centres. The number of absentees declined significantly from 165 (3.1%) of last year to only 56 (1.3%) this year of whom 36 (64%) were girls and 20 (36%) were boys. A total of 3,736 (86%) passed compared to 3,704 (71%) candidates of the previous year while 556 (13%) failed compared to 1,369 (27%) of the previous year. A total of 123 (2.9%) candidates passed in first grade compared to 173 (3%) candidates the previous year of whom 70 (57%) were boys and 53 (43%) were girls. Out of the 123 first grades, 34 (28%) were from UPE schools while 89 (72%) were from private schools compared to the previous year's 48 (28%) and 125 (72%) respectively.

With held Results

For Kaliro district, results for 77 candidates from (003635) Kyani Parents P/S were withheld on grounds of suspected malpractice. We are yet to be invited to meet the UNEB security committee on a date to be communicated later.

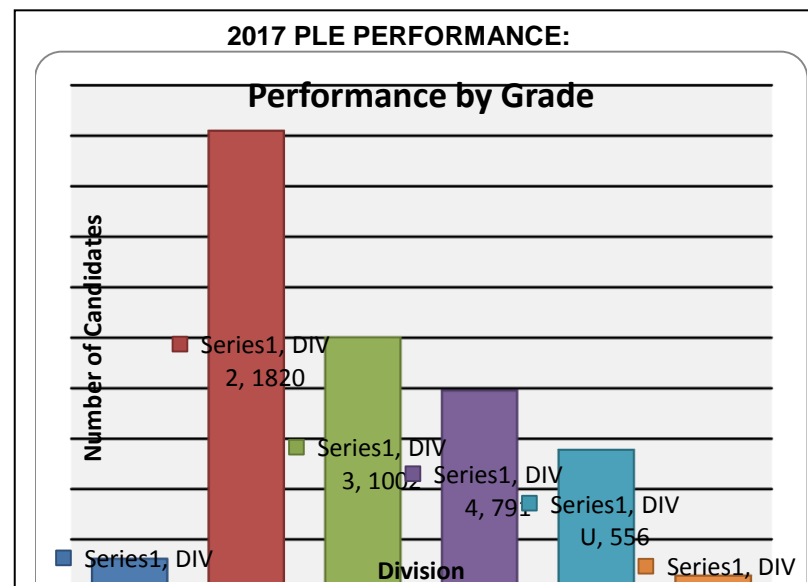

ISSUES TO NOTE:

- Total number of candidates registered was 4,425 but 77 candidates' results were withheld. The above analysis therefore is for 4,348 candidates.
- Nansololo and Kisinda sub-counties did not get any first grade.
- Kaliro Town Council remained the best in terms of percentage pass overall at 98.7%
- Namwiwa sub-county remained the last in terms of percentage pass at 67.3% compared to last year's 56.4%
- The number of failures significantly reduced from 1369 (27.0%) of the previous year to 556 (13.0%)
- 34 (28%) of the first grades (compared to last year's 48 (28%)) are from UPE schools and 89 (72%) from the private schools.
- Budomero sub-county had the biggest number of drop outs followed by Buyinda, Kisinda and Kasokwe while Bukamba, Kaliro T/C and Nansololo had the least.

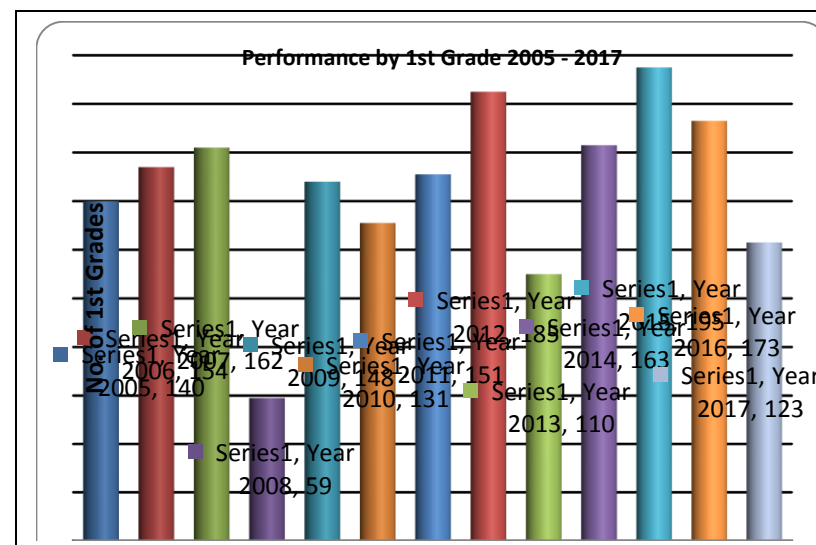


Issues to note:

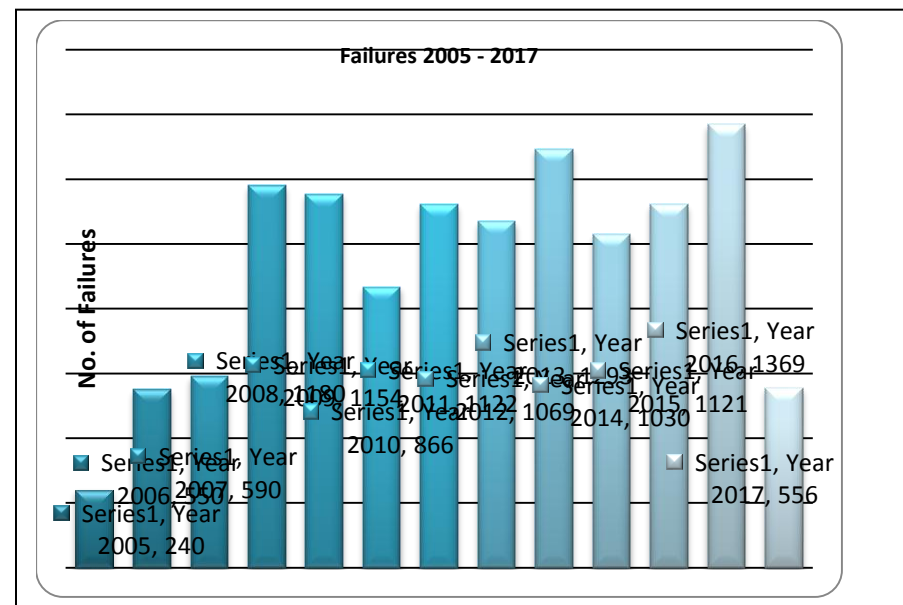
- The numbers of first grades were 123 (2.9%) representing a decline by 1% from 173 (3%) of the previous year 2016.
- Second grades increased from the previous year's 27.5% to 42.4%
- Third graders increased from 21.3% of the previous year to 23.3%
- Fourth graders stagnated 18%
- The number of failures (Division U) significantly reduced from last year's 26% to 13%
- The number of candidates who missed the examinations (Division X) also significantly reduced from 3% to 1.3%.
- Total number of candidates who passed increased by 10% i.e. from 3,380 (76%) of last year to 3,736 (86%).

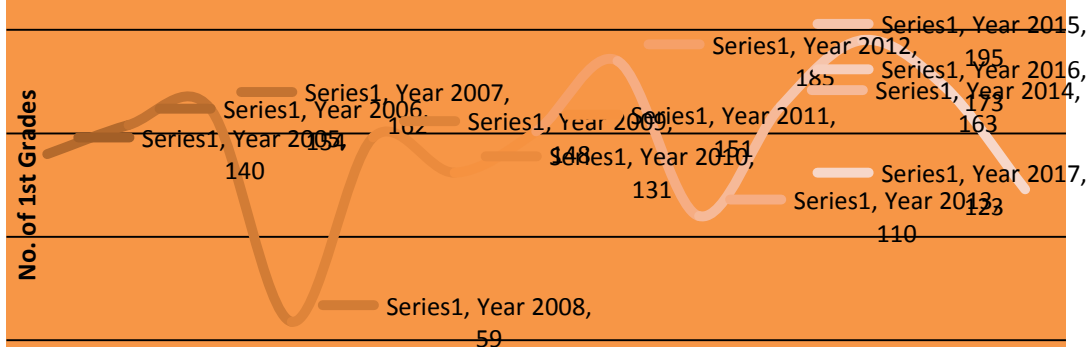

SOME OF THE REASONS FOR THE IMPROVEMENT IN PLE PERFORMANCE IN THE DISTRICT:

- Signing of the commitment letters with parents after registration greatly contributed to the decline in the number of absentees. School heads made the pupils to commit themselves in writing before their parents to remain in school until after writing the final examinations. They were threatened with arrest and imprisonment if they dared to drop out before the final PLE examination. This in one way or the other kept the young ones in school to the time of examinations hence reducing on the would-be failures.
- The presence of the departmental vehicle has done us more good. Mobility in the field is now easier than before. It has helped us to reach all corners of the district to give technical support to the teachers especially in terms of school inspection.

TARGETS FOR 2017

- Increase the number of first grades from 2.9% to 10%
- Reduce the failure rate from 13% to 5%
- Reduce the number of P.7 drop outs from 1.3% to 0.5%

RECOMMENDATIONS FOR CONTINUOUS IMPROVEMENT IN ACADEMIC PERFORMANCE IN THE DISTRICT

- Politicians should continue sensitizing the people of Kaliro to enable all the stake holders appreciate the role of education in development.
- DEO's office should continue making deliberate efforts to create model government aided schools with the best staffing. It has been tried with Budini Girls' P/S and Bulumba P/S and the efforts have paid off. (See results of the said schools)
- CAO should frequently squeeze some little funds out of the little available to facilitate DEO's office to constantly monitor teaching, organize workshops/seminars for teachers and head teachers.
- DIS should continue with frequent inspection of schools to scale down teachers and consequently pupils absenteeism.
- Head teachers should constantly monitor their teachers especially in the classes P.3-P.6 where teachers seem to be relaxed most hence weakening the pupils' foundation for P.7 class.
- Parents should provide mid-day meals to their children to increase the attention span of their children while at school.
- The practice of attaching schools to individual district staff should be strengthened for easy coordination and follow up. The Internal Auditor, Mr. Kagaha Stephen has demonstrated with Busulumba PS that it is possible for a district staff to monitor a particular school and give feedback for improvement. If only this is extended to the rest of the members to pick interest and therefore be attached to particular schools, we would go a long way in improving our performance.
- Head teachers should continue making the candidates sign commitment letters with the schools during registration to reduce on the would-be drop outs.

Conclusion:

Improving the quality of education in any society is a game of all stakeholders. No single individual or category of individuals can claim capacity to handle the mantle alone. We all need to move in the same spirit. The head teacher though needs to be more converted to quality than anybody else. What is done in a school on a daily basis determines the performance of that school. The head teacher determines the school routine. We therefore need such an army of converts to command the rest of the soldiers at school level to improve their performance. Like the old adage goes, "show me a good head teacher, and I show you a good school."
